

GRANDJEAN CAMPGROUND

State: Idaho **This is a national campground.**

Name of Campground or Area: Grandjean Campground

Reservable: Yes/No **Number of sites:** 18 mixed use. If you want a site you'd best arrive Monday through Thursday.

Location: (Lohman) Campground is one the east side of the Sawtooth Mountains.

Directions from Boise Off highway 21 on the west side of the Sawtooths. About 3.25 hours from Boise. (best route: Hwy. 55 > Lohman Garden City road> north on Hwy 21. If you take Hwy 21 from Boise it is very winding and slower.)

Amenities:

- **Size of sites:** Size varies, but there is plenty of room. Sites on the “back side of the loop” have hitching rails.
- **Toilet:** vault
- **Shower:** no
- **Water for people:** No
- **Shore Power:** no
- **Fees:** \$14 per night. Minus 50% if you have a national senior pass.
- **Camp host or ranger:** Yes
- **Corals:** There are 3 corals about 100 yds. Up the hill from camping area. First come, first serve. They are wooden, 1 very large 60 ft sq. and 2 smaller ones about 30 ft. there are some large rocks in the corals. Water available at corals, but iffy it is running.
- **Trees for high lining:** Yes
- **Hitching rails:** yes. One per site
- **Manure disposal:** No. take it home or scatter well away from Camp site.
- **Water for horses:** Continuous flow trough at the trail head. NO faucet
- **Tent pads:** not really, but there are some level grassy areas.
- **Cabins or yurts:** No, but there is a lodge and rental cabins about 3 miles away.
- **Fire pits.** Yes
- **Picnic table:** yes
- **Certified weed free hay required:** yes

Type of trails and terrain:

- **Dirt, Rock, bridges, water crossing** (about 20” deep and 30 FT. wide over large river rock. Can be flowing heavily. Stunning views! Maintenance of trails degrades the farther from the campground. Clearing of trails can be iffy until late August if at all. Call to confirm. There are ample opportunities for horse water on the trail.

- Are trails shared with motorized devices: No: Designated wilderness area, so no motors or bicycles. Trails shared by hikers.
- Trail maps or signage: Yes, but condition, readability may vary.
- How far from camp are trail heads: Trail head at the edge of the campground.
