Type of trails and terrain: There are a few trails from camping area. To ride the more adventuresome trails you will need to trailer to the trailhead (5-10 miles). The area includes the Sawtooth and White mountains trails. Technical riding level.

Mostly easy, but there are unavoidable areas of 9-10 out of ten for technical levels.

- Dirt, rocks, water crossings, bridges, hills, steep, width, trees, lakes, mountains etc.
- Are trails shared with motorized devices: mostly not. Shared with hikers and a few bicycles, most of trails become designated wilderness, so no bikes in that area.
